

This month we thought it would be good to share how DeMolay and Masons has similar history and symbolisms.

DeMolay and the Masonic Lodge both celebrate a rich heritage of symbolism, but with distinctive elements tailored to their specific values and teachings. While the square and compass serve as a central emblem of Freemasonry, symbolizing morality and the boundaries of good conduct, DeMolay adopts the chevalier ring, signifying the virtues of love, honor, and fidelity. This ring, often worn by senior members of DeMolay, represents a commitment to higher ideals and personal integrity, mirroring the Masonic dedication to ethical living and personal development.

Moreover, both organizations place a strong emphasis on the journey of self-improvement and enlightenment. For Masons, the plumb, level, and square are tools that symbolize truth, equality, and fairness, guiding members in their personal and communal lives. DeMolay, in contrast, highlights seven cardinal virtues: filial love, reverence for sacred things, courtesy, comradeship, fidelity, cleanness, and patriotism, each contributing to the character building of young men. These virtues, although more in number than those explicitly symbolized in Masonic imagery, reflect a shared ethos with Freemasonry: the cultivation of moral strength, community service, and the pursuit of knowledge.
